Each year, *Juniata Voices* publishes a selection of the speeches, lectures, and presentations given on the campus of Juniata College, in Huntingdon, Pennsylvania. The twenty-one pieces that follow provide but a small sample of the dozens of "voices" that spoke during the 2015-2016 academic year. The talks include Juniata faculty members speaking at convocations and in the regular series of Bookend Seminars, a current student's prize-winning speech at the Bailey Oratorical Contest, and visiting speakers addressing topics ranging from the socio-economic transformation of post-apartheid South Africa to the ways in which the "new" coyote is preying upon deer in the eastern United States.
