Intern of the Month

Last summer Juniata College student Sam Gary participated in the Amgen Program. He first heard about this program from his Organic Chemistry discussion leader during his freshman year. The Amgen program gave Sam the opportunity to perform biomedical research at a top 5 medical school through a premier undergraduate research program. Sam stated that the most interesting quality of the program were the types of research available for him to take part in. Sam Gary was responsible for anesthetizing, perfusing and fixing mice. He then prepared nerves for scanning in the MRI machine and scanned the nerves in different simulated pathological environments. Sam's goal was to prove that the MRI imaging model developed by his Principal Investigator (PI) was the most accurate in quantifying nerve characteristics in nerve diseases like multiple sclerosis. He also assisted his PI in creating experiments that will enable the gathering of necessary information to draw conclusions and further their research. Sam said, "My favorite part about this internship is that you are given the rare opportunity to perform groundbreaking medical research as an undergraduate that is only afforded to a handful of institutions in the U.S." Sam will be graduating in the spring semester of 2017, and plans to pursue a Fulbright Fellowship in a Spanish-speaking Latin American country either performing research or teaching English as a second language. Then, he wants to pursue an MD/Ph.D. degree in neuroscience; specifically in research mechanisms in the brain following traumatic brain injury and concussions. Sam's internship supported his initial interest to pursue a MD/ Ph.D. degree in order to combine patient care and biomedical research.
