Students will be provided an overview of job, career and graduate/professional school search techniques. Learn to write professional resumes and other job search correspondence while enhancing interpersonal skills to be used at job fairs, interviews and in other professional settings.

Intern of the Month

Over the summer, Brea Neri was the Child Sponsorship and Donor Relations Intern at the Dalit Freedom Network (DFN), human rights, non-government organization based in Washington, D.C., that partners with the oppressed Dalit population in India. She chose to intern there because she was interested in exploring areas of advocacy and public diplomacy more thoroughly. She also wanted an inside look into how non-governmental organizations work to make an impact on international issues such as poverty and human trafficking. While there Brea worked on the Summer Mailing Project as well as created a detailed inventory spreadsheet of DFN merchandise and updated lists of sponsored and unsponsored children from each of the over 40 Indian schools with whom DFN works. She also contributed to social media efforts in attempts of retaining sponsors as well as acquiring new sponsors. While in the field she expanded on her ability to quickly adapt to a changing workplace and communicate effectively with co-workers.

Brea plans to graduate in the Spring of 2015, and wants to have a career in either advocacy and government relations or public diplomacy and foreign service. Because of this internship, she has decided to apply for a Fulbright Scholarship to teach English in India and hopefully learn more about issues related to women's rights and human trafficking there.
