PLUS AN ADDITIONAL 15 CREDITS AT THE 300-400 LEVEL

A POE must contain 45–63 credits, including a minimum of 18 credits at the 300–400 level

The Designated POE in Psychology must contain a minimum of 36 Psychology/PY credits

Students may include 9 credits from related disciplines that count towards the 45 POE credits

PY 490, Psychology Internship, may not count as part of the upper-level 300–400 course requirements

Only 6 total credits of PY 340/341, Research in Psychology, may count towards the 45 POE credits

PY 360, PY 361 and PY 415 may not be taken as Pass/Fail
