When the opportunity to sponsor Juniata College's new gateway entrances was presented, the committee enthusiastically endorsed the idea.

Until recently, visitors to Juniata had little indication of when they were entering campus. Creating distinct gateways to mark the college's boundaries represents an exciting step forward in celebrating and

strengthening Juniata's presence. Our class gift will help underwrite the existing brick gateway at Moore Street and support construction of a new gateway at the intersection of Cold Springs Road and College Avenue.

These entrances will not only enhance the campus's appearance but also serve as proud symbols of Juniata's identity. In addition, the gateways will include a commemorative element displayed near the plaque honoring Juniata's founding in 1876—an especially meaningful connection for the Class of 1976, the college's 100th graduating class. The Legacy Committee is confident this project will be a lasting and visible tribute to our class's spirit and commitment to Juniata.
